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

Step 3: Towel-blot your strands to remove excess drippage. Apply your favorite detangling product or leave-in conditioning product

Step 4: If you want to go for Teri's sleek straight style, be sure to either apply a defrisant product like Phytodefrisant or a straightening balm like Robert Hallowell's Flat Factor. Distribute a dime-sized dollop of the product of your choice into the palms of your hands and mix well. Use your fingers to work the product completely through your tresses.

Step 5: Separate your hair into two-inch sections and blow-dry with a large round brush, starting near the back of the head and working around to the front on either side. To create extra volume, hold brush in the hair near the scalp until the hair cools (about five seconds), then move the brush down and through to the ends of the hair.

Step 6: To create a super straight finish, use a hot flat iron to touch up any sections that require a smoother texture.

Step 7: If desired, spray lightly with the hairspray of your choice. Finish with a shine serum or spray.

Starting In Soapland

Marcia Cross made her acting debut in sixth grade in a school play. From that moment, she was determined to become an actress. In 1984 she starred as Liz Correll on the long running soap opera *The Edge of Night*. After a couple years of appearing in a few TV shows, Marcia popped up on *Another World* as Tanya in 1986. Then she took on the role of Katheryn "Kate" Sanders on *One Life To Live* from 1986 until 1987. From 1991 until 1992 she was on *Knots Landing* as Victoria Broyelard, during the same time that Nicollette Sheridan was on the nighttime soap/drama. Marcia also guest starred on an amazing array of award winning series including *Cheers, Who's The Boss, Seinfeld, Ally McBeal, CSI* and *The King Of Queens.*

She definitely seems more focused on her role as a wife, mother and professional actress. In fact, she often appears at film events on the arm of her equally talented actor husband.

43 & Fabulous

Not only is *Desperate Housewives* a fabulous show with a great cast of characters that have saved us from the void *Sex And The City* left, it has blown off the doors for actresses who have left 40 in the rearview mirror. Felicity, along with the other 40 plus actresses on Wisteria Lane, have demonstrated that you can still look hot and have a sizzling career regardless of your age.



Felicity Huffman

Offscreen Felicity Huffman appears to be a lot less frazzled than her high-strung *Desperate Housewives* character, Lynette Scavo. Keeping up with her two young daughters, Sofia Grace, born in 2000, and Georgia Grace, born in 2002, may seem trying at times, but Felicity has her act together. She's also happily married to the highly respected actor, William H. Macy, and perhaps that's just one of the reasons she's more focused on doing a great job as an actress than worrying about on-screen feuds or other unnecessary dramas.



Soft & Curly Ponytail

If you prefer to go with Felicity's soft pony, complete the following instructions:

Step 1: Start with "day old" completely dry hair. Apply a small dime-sized blob of Paves Professional Flawless It's A Wrap hair cream to the palms of your hands. Use your fingers to evenly distribute the cream from the top of the ears down to the ends. Avoid applying any product near the scalp which can make hair greasy and prone to falling flat.

Step 2: Use a large boar or an all natural bristle brush to brush all strands off of the face. Felicity has loose tendrils on either side. If you wish to copy those, use a comb to pull them out of the rest of your hair.

Step 3: Using fingers, carefully smooth the sides and back of your tresses into a high ponytail that rests right below the back of your crown. Pull all the hair around the front and sides into a sleek pony.

Step 4: Tie off the newly created ponytail with a "hair friendly" elastic band in the same hue as your hair color.

Step 5: Once the ponytail is carefully tied off, lightly back-comb the entire tail to give it fullness and encourage curls to form.

Step 6: Use your fingers to carefully smooth the back-combed ponytail hair down. If you wish, use a one and a half-inch curling iron to "touch up" all the ends and add back some curls.

Step 7: Spray with hairspray and for added dazzle, apply a tiny drop of shine serum or spray for extra gloss.

Steal Felicity's Look

Right now Felicity is busy filming new projects, including the movie *Choose* Your Own Adventure: The Abominable Snowman, taking care of her family and making the required round of appearances on the various talk shows.

On the red carpet the award winning actress isn't atraid to let her hair down. Since *Housewives* appeared in 2004, Felicity has shown up in some stunning couture gowns with her long layered bob coiffed in a variety of styles including loose sassy curls, twisted up in a cascade of bouncy tendrils and worn silky straight. She morphs back and forth, courtesy of great hairdressers, between full blown bangs, center and side parts.

Unlike her character Lynette who seems to have endless bad hair days, Felicity is blessed with healthy, glossy tresses that currently cascade just below the top of her shoulders. Her face is mostly an oval shape with some square angles and a slightly prominent. To achieve Felicity's sleek and straight, slightly layered bob style or to copy her gorgeous curls, complete the following steps:

Step 1: For dry or super fragile strands, select a super moisturizing shampoo formula like Phytojoba or one designed for your specific hair type, texture and current condition. Experiment with diluting the shampoo for extra gentleness.

Step 2: Gently squeeze excess water out of the strands. Apply your favorite conditioner with your fingers. Leave on for five minutes and rinse with cool water.

Step 3: Towel-blot your strands to remove excess water. Apply your favorite detangling product or leave-in conditioning product based on your type, texture and current condition of your strands.

Step 4: If you want to go for Felicity's sleek straight style, be sure to either apply a defrisant product like Phytodefrisant or a straightening balm like Robert Hallowell's Flat Factor. Distribute a dime-sized dollop of the product of your choice into the palms of your hands and mix well. Use your fingers to work the product completely through your tresses.

Step 5: Separate your hair into two-inch sections and blow-dry with a large round brush, starting near the back of the head and working around to the front on either side. To create extra volume, hold brush in the hair near the scalp until the hair cools (about five seconds), then move the brush down and through to the ends of the hair.

Step 6: To create a super straight finish, separate strands into twoinch strands and then use a hot flat iron to touch up any sections that require a smoother texture. Work around the head from side to side to achieve an even look.

Saucy Curis: If you prefer to add saucy curis like Felicity opts for at times, separate strands into one to two-inch sections. Use a two-inch curling iron or hot rollers to set hair. Let new curls cool completely and then remove. Tousle with your fingers.

Step 7: If desired, spray lightly with the hairspray of your choice. Finish with a shine serum or spray. Apply to the palms of your hands and lightly brush across the surface of your hair.



Playing Wisteria Lane's resident lingerie-clad temptress, Eva has learned that "using her body to promote her acting career is not such as awful thing." In reality the Latin beauty is very comfortable with her body. "Body image is all what you create in your head," she said. "I think you create that by your experiences in life. You get that way by our experiences with people, how you interact with your friends, how you interact at school."

Indeed, Eva has expressed the fact that she "loves the womanly figure that my body's becoming including the soft angle, the hips and the legs." While she favors tailored clothes that perfectly fit her proportions and figure, she also adores couture designers like Roberto Cavalli, Oscar de la Renta, Halston and the diva qualities of Luca Luca.

Super Sexy Nape Twist

If you prefer to go with Eva's glamourous updo that she wore to offset her spectacular gown at the Screen Actors Guild Awards, follow the instructions below.

Step 1: Start with "day old" completely dry hair. Apply a small dimesized blob of Paves Professional Flawless It's A Wrap hair cream to the palms of your hands. Use your fingers to evenly distribute the cream from only the top of the ears down to the ends.

Step 2: Use an all natural bristle brush to direct your strands up and off of the face. Allow the hair to fall in a loose off-center part.

Step 3: Using your fingers, carefully smooth the sides and back of your tresses into a low loose ponytail that rests right at the nape of the neck. Allow some looseness on top for some height.

Step 4: Loosely tie off the newly created ponytail with a "hair friendly" elastic band or Bungee in the same hue as your hair color.

Step 5: Once the ponytail is carefully tied off, you will create a soft twist or "fat bun." Use your fingers to smooth the newly formed ponytail. With the thumb and forefinger of one hand, grab the pony at the base. Use the other hand to lift the pony at the ends and while still holding the base, wrap the ponytail around the base of the Blax or the Bungee.

Step 6: Use your fingers to hold the newly formed twist or bun in place. Use bobby pins in the same color as your hair to anchor the bun against your scalp. Depending on the length and thickness of your hair, you will need eight to 20 hair pins. Pin the bun in a clockwise direction.

Step 7: Spray with hairspray.

Step 1: Start with a hair treatment program designed to protect and maintain highlights. Or select a brunette enhancing shampoo or color mask designed to maintain and protect your rich hues.

Step 2: Gently squeeze excess water out of the strands. Apply your favorite conditioner with your fingers and rinse

Step 3: Towel-blot your strands to remove excess water. Apply your favorite detangling product or leave-in conditioning product based on your type, texture and current condition of your strands.

Step 4: If you want to go for Eva's sleek straight style, be sure to either apply a defrisant product like Phytodefrisant or a straightening balm like Robert Hallowell's Flat Factor. Distribute a dimesized dollop of the product of your choice into the palms of your hands and mix well. Use your fingers to work the product completely through your tresses.

Step 5: Separate your hair into two-inch sections and blow-dry with a large round brush, starting near the back of the head and working around to the front on either side.

Just when you thought that Nicollette Sheridan had vanished from TV forever, she's risen to A-list status on the smash ABC hit. Desperate Housewives.

The eternally pale blonde Scorpion actress first appeared on the scene in 1984's Paper Dolls. In 1985 she generated major movie star buzz in The Sure Thing with John Cusack. She then burst onto the Knots Landing scene in 1986 as sizzling sex kitten Paige Matheson to stir up lots of trouble until her departure in 1993.

Ask the Hair Doctor

I have very thin and long hair, and I am thinking about dying it back to my natural color. My natural hue is light brown but I've had it dyed darker for years. How should I go about using an at-home hair coloring kit to get my hair back to its natural shade and how much of the product should I use?— Mrs. O'Neil

Home hair coloring can be a fantastic option for many consumers if they take the time to research their hair coloring project before they move forward and take action. I commend you on taking the time to find the right answers for you and your hair before getting started.

Please keep in mind that hair color, even when done by professionals can be a very complex topic that has a lot of potential issues to consider. You mention that your hair is very long and thin. While hair color does have the advantage of plumping up the hair cuticle, depending on your current color, you may not be able to go lighter without using a product that lifts the current color from your strands. Going lighter MAY require a product with a bleach component.

Because there are a lot of possibilities, I would suggest that before you select a specific brand or specific color, you consult with the major hair color companies that offer consumer hotlines or advice. All of the major home hair color companies usually offer a toll free line for consumers to call that will help them make selections that will meet the consumer's current needs, including what you will need to do to completely cover your long strands.

You can also visit the extensive Clairol consumer friendly hair color site on the Web at www.clairol.com or call L'Oreal, which is also a wonderful company, at their toll free phone number which is 1-888-4-LOREAL. They also offer hair color makeover help at www.garnierusa.com.

In your case you have some issues and questions to consider:

 How light do you wish to go? Usually it is best to stay within two shades of either your current or natural hair color. Can you go lighter without lifting your current color? This may or may not be possible depending on how dark your current color is. 2. If you wish to go a lot lighter than two shades, what hair color product type would you require? Keep in mind that hair color products run the gamut from temporary colors, which will not lighten but only enrich and deepen existing hues, to permanent colors, which will remain on the strands until they grow out. Permanent hair color is most likely to offer the chemical formulations such as bleach or other chemical agents that will lift your current color and deposit a lighter shade. There is also the option to go with a product that first lifts and then requires you to add a toner to create a lighter color.

3. It is important to consider the current condition of your hair. Is it super healthy or does it have some damage issues left over from previous hair coloring applications? This is key to determining whether there is a risk to coloring your hair at this point. When hair is dry or over porous from previous coloring, it is often best to avoid altering the current shade until your hair is in prime health or further damage could occur.

4. Can you live with just adding highlights around your face to open up your eyes and skin tone without risking possible damage by coloring your entire head of hair? Highlights offer the advantage of going from two to four shades lighter and brighter without coloring the entire head. Many of the home haircolor companies offer streaking or highlight kits that will allow you to lighten just around your face and hairline.

5. Can you afford to visit a professional hair colorist? If so, then make an appointment for a CONSULTATION ONLY (most places offer free consultations so ask the salon when booking this appointment). This gives you the chance to listen and take notes about your hair and then go home and mull over the possible options. At that point you may decide to move forward to take a new direction.

6. If a professional colorist is not an option, decide on a consumer hair color brand that appeals to you whether it is L'Oreal, Clairol or Revlon, and then contact their consumer help lines for advice. By Karen M. Shelton www.hairboutique.com

7. If you decide to go lighter and do decide to do it at home, you will probably need to buy two hair color kits to handle your long hair. There is nothing worse than being in the middle of coloring your hair and then running out of formula. Of course, your best bet is to get as many answers as possible in advance from the hair color companies and be sure to ask them how many kits you may need to cover your long hair.

Be sure to keep in mind that once you color with a new shade, the next application of hair color should only be to the roots. Overlapping color on existing strands will damage them and tend to cause them to become overly dry and potentially brittle. That is why it is recommended that color refreshing only be done to the roots.

Steal Lindsay's Style

Since 2002, Lindsay has made major changes in her life and her appearance. The natural redhead who appears to enjoy wearing her hair long, also seems to enjoy the dramatic changes that hair coloring provides to her image and overall look. Lindsay is now seen sporting bright golden-blonde tresses that she has been wearing in lots of curls and waves.

The advantage to Lindsay's classic long, slightly layered style is that it offers a lot of versatility. It can be easily worn up or down, depending on the event. The biggest drawback to this style, especially if hair is fine, thin or stick straight, is that hair may droop or fall flat.

Step 1: Shampoo and condition your hair with your normal products designed for your current hair type, texture and condition. Rinse well with a cool water rinse which helps build natural volume and increase shine.

Step 2: Towel-blot strands. Detangle strands from the ends to the roots.

Step 3: Apply a volumizing gel or similar products to the roots. To protect against heat and add body, distribute a leave-in conditioner, mousse or gel from the top of the ears to the ends. Distribute well.

Step 4: Working from side to side use a boar's head or natural round brush combined with your blow dryer to straighten and build in body.

Step 5: To build in volume at the roots, use the round brush to lift your tresses up and direct the air flow from the dryer up the hair shaft to the root. This "ruffles the cuticle" helping to add natural fullness. If you prefer, bend over at the waist and direct the air flow of the dryer up the hair shaft towards the roots. When hair is 90% dry, bend right-side up and work on the hair from the ears down to the ends.

Step 6: Use the round brush to straighten the remainder of the hair by rolling individual sections carefully around the brush and directing the air flow down the hair shaft towards the ends.

Step 7: While drying the ends, use the round brush to flip ends up slightly while finishing.

Step 8: Seal the style by finishing up with a blast of cool air, if possible, from your blow dryer.

Step 9: Spray with a strong hold hairspray or volume spray. Apply a tiny drop of shine serum or spray to your tresses.

Step 10: If you like you can use a curling iron to flip up the ends a little bit or use a straight iron on selected pieces around the face to give a contrasting texture to the look.





Select a super moisturizing shampoo formula like Phytojoba or one designed for colored hair like Phytocitrus. For ultra dry or super fragile strands, use the dry hair formulas and dilute the shampoo for extra gentleness.

Step 2

After one application of shampoo, rinse well. Keep in mind that if shampoo is not completely removed, a soap film will remain on your strands and cause them to be dull or hard to manage.

When you have finished rinsing your strands gently squeeze out any excess water with your fingers. Apply your favorite rinse-out conditioning product. Match the product to your hair type, texture and condition. Work the conditioner into the driest parts of your hair. Leave on for up to five minutes. Rinse well and finish with a cool to cold water rinse.

Step 3

Towel-blot your strands to remove excess drippage. Apply your favorite detangling product or leave-in conditioning product based on your type, texture and current condition of your strands.

Step 4

If you want to go for Molly's sleek straight style, be sure to either apply a defrisant product like Phytodefrisant or a straightening balm like Robert Hallowell's Flat Factor. Distribute a dime-sized dollop of the product of your choice into the palms of your hands and mix well. Use your fingers to work the product completely through your tresses.

Step 5

If you prefer to go with Molly's loose curled look, follow all of the steps above until Step 4.

Step 4

Apply a styling mousse like Paves Professional Red Carpet Firm Hold Styling Mousse or Rene Furterer Anti-Dehydrating Structuring Mousse Strong Hold, and dry hair completely with a blow drver. Substitute a one and a 1/2-inch barrel curling iron for the flat iron.

Step 5

Separate strands into one- to two-inch sections. Working from side to side, wrap each section around the hot iron. Hold for up to 10 seconds. Gently release the curling iron and roll the hot new curl around your fingertips and then pin against your scalp to cool. Continue to curl and pin until your entire head has been curled. If you prefer, use medium to large sized hot rollers for a tighter and longer lasting set.

Step 6

Let pinned curls completely cool. Before removing the pins spray the hair liberally with a good holding hairspray like Paves Professional Flawless Convertible-Proof Firm Hold Hairspray or PhytoPro Instant Hold Spray #15. For fine or thin strands, use Phytolague Soie Hairspray designed for a softer hold.

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
